Adult Protection

Investigates and works to resolve reports of abuse, exploitation, neglect and self neglect of vulnerable adults ages 18 and older.

GED Testing and Tutoring

Offers individuals free GED (high school equivalency) tutoring and testing in Idaho Falls and Salmon. Please call for schedules.

Homeless to Homeowners

Individuals successfully completing the Haven Shelter program are moved to main stream housing opportunities, with home ownership being the ultimate goal.

Long Term Care Ombudsman

Advocates and assists in problem solving for persons in long term care settings (assisted living centers or skilled nursing and rehabilitation centers). Problems, complaints or concerns focus on choices, residents' rights, quality of care or other long term care issues.

Senior Services

Provides information regarding services currently available to senior citizens, including assistance with Medicare/Medicaid and other public programs. They also provide Homememaker Assistance and Home Delivered Meals to eligible seniors.

Energy Assistance

Heating bills from November to March are subsidized for low-income households. Income guidelines are adjusted yearly; please contact EICAP for more information.

Low-to-Moderate Income Housing

Housing opportunities for households with low to moderate income are available in Idaho Falls, Blackfoot, Rexburg and Roberts. Please call our main office for availability and other eligibility requirements.

Mutual Self-Help Housing

Build your own home or update your existing home with no down payment and a mortgage payment tied to your income. Households that have acceptable credit should contact main office for additional eligibility requirements.

Senior and Disabled Housing

Housing opportunities for senior (62+) and/or disabled individuals are available in Arco, St. Anthony and Idaho Falls. Please call main office for availability and other eligibility requirements.

Weatherization

Provides winterizing measures to increase a home's energy efficiency. Qualifying Energy Assistance households are automatically placed on Weatherization's waiting list.

Caregiver Services

Offers respite to give "the gift of time" to individuals taking care of family members at home by providing companionship and supervision to homebound adults. Also available is a Caregiver Support Group that meets the first Tuesday of every month.

Haven Shelter

Provides short-term transitional housing and comprehensive services to homeless families and individuals.

Head Start

A free preschool for children 3-5 years old. Classes are held 4 days a week for 3.5 hours a day. Children must be 3 or 4 by Sept. 1st and parents must provide transportation for their children

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren

Works with individuals who are in need of information, resources, and support regarding a variety of issues including: medical, legal, behavior and school issues. Also available is a Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Support Group that meets on the last Tuesday of every month.



Food Bank Warehouse

We provide USDA Commodities and donated food to the following: food banks in Salmon, Rexburg, Challis, Dubois, Mackay, Mud Lake, Driggs, St. Anthony and six food banks in Idaho Falls. Please call for distribution schedules for each facility.
